



Hitchcock County Board of Commissioners

Trenton, Nebraska July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019

A meeting of the County Board of Commissioners of Hitchcock County, Nebraska was held at the Hitchcock County Courthouse Commissioner's Room, 229 East D Street, Trenton, Nebraska on Monday, the 1<sup>st</sup>, day of July, 2019 commencing at 9:00 o'clock a.m. Present were Chair Paul Nichols, Commissioners Scott McDonald and Ron Wertz, and County Clerk Margaret Pollmann. Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Hitchcock County News, the designated method for giving notice. Board agendas are posted on the County's website <a href="www.hitchcockcounty.ne.gov">www.hitchcockcounty.ne.gov</a>. Notice of the meeting was given to the Chair and all members of the Board. All proceedings hereafter shown where taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public. The Open Meetings Act was available for review and Chair indicated the location of such copy in the room where the meeting was being held.

Chair Nichols called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

Anthony Bishop inquired as to wages due and insurance.

Jim Bowen, Project Coordinator, Southwest Weed Management and Weed Superintendent Bill Hagemann joined the meeting. Mr. Bowen advised as to program offerings and efforts to control invasive species in Southwest Nebraska. Further Mr. Bowen advised as to the Western Republican River Basin Riparian Habitat Improvement Project for 2019-2020 and asked for a letter of support to the Nebraska Department of Agriculture to obtain grant funding. Extensive discussion held on pooling resources and it's affect on the weed superintendents' county responsibilities.

Attorney D. Eugene Garner joined the meeting.

Member McDonald moved to direct Chair to execute a letter of support addressed to the Nebraska Department of Agriculture regarding funding for Southwest Weed Management's participation in Western Republican River Basin Riparian Habitat Improvement Project for 2019-2020. Member Wertz seconded the motion and after consideration, the following members voted in favor of the motion: McDonald, Wertz, and Nichols. Motion carried.

Craig Softley, Hayes County Economic Development Coordinator met with the board to discuss Community Development Block Grant programs through Rural Economic Development of the United State Department of Agriculture.

Senator Dan Hughes joined the meeting and offered a legislative update. Assessor Terra Riggs joined the meeting and discussion was held on CREP valuations and Tax Equalization and Review Commission (TERC) past decisions regarding the same. Economic development was also discussed.

Member Wertz offered Resolution #19-10 and moved for its' adoption. Member Nichols seconded the motion and after consideration the roll was called thereupon and the following members voted in favor of the motion: McDonald, Nichols, and Wertz. Said resolution having been consented to by a majority of all members elected to said County Board, was by the Chair declared passed and adopted. A true, correct and complete copy of said resolution is as follows:

### **RESOLUTION #19-10**

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Commissioners of Hitchcock County, Nebraska, pursuant to Nebraska Statute, is vested with the authority of administering the affairs of Hitchcock County, Nebraska; and





**WHEREAS**, it has been determined that a Hitchcock County Local Emergency Operations Plan has been developed in order to provide for a coordinated response to a disaster or emergency in Hitchcock County, and the villages in Hitchcock County; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Commissioners of Hitchcock County, deems it advisable and in the best interest of Hitchcock County to approve said Local Emergency Operations Plan; and

**WHEREAS**, the acceptance of this 2019 Local Emergency Operations Plan supersedes all previously approved Hitchcock County Local Emergency Operations Plans.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Commissioners of Hitchcock County, Nebraska, that the Hitchcock County Local Emergency Operations Plan be, and hereby is, approved.
