Member McDonald moved to increase the restricted funds authority by an additional 1% for the 2024/2025 budget. Member Nichols seconded the motion and after consideration the roll was called thereupon and the following members voted in favor of the motion: McDonald, Wertz, and Nichols. Motion carried.

The Board was in receipt of the 2024 Audit Report. Attorney Garner advised as to the proposed letter of engagement by and between Donald D. Wilson and the County for the June 30, 2025 audit. This item will be placed on the December 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2024 agenda.

Member Wertz moved to accept and approve the Financial Statements With Independent Auditor Reports Thereon for the Year Ended June 30, 2024. Member McDonald seconded the motion and after consideration the following members voted in favor of the motion: McDonald, Nichols, and Wertz. Motion carried.

Member McDonald offered Resolution #24-21 and moved for its' adoption. Member Nichols seconded the motion and after consideration the roll was called thereupon and the following members voted in favor of the motion: Wertz, Nichols and McDonald. Said resolution having been consented to by a majority of all members elected to said County Board, was by the Chair declared passed and adopted. ## **RESOLUTION #24-21**

**WHEREAS**, the County of Hitchcock, Nebraska, is a political subdivision of the State of Nebraska; and

WHEREAS, NEB. REV. STAT.§39-1723 provides in pertinent part that any person desiring the vacation or abandonment of any county road shall file a petition in the County Clerk's office; and

WHEREAS, NEB. REV. STAT.§39-1723 and NEB. REV. STAT.§39-1723 set forth the process to be followed by the County upon the filing of such a petition; and

**WHEREAS**, based upon past experience, it is estimated that the County will expend approximately \$1,500.00 through the process, including without limitation: (a) obtaining a written report from the county highway superintendent regarding his study of the use being made of such public road; (b) publication expense for the notice of the public hearing; and (c) service by either registered or certified mail upon the owners of land abutting on or adjacent to said; and

WHEREAS, the County Board, finding there is nothing in the applicable statutes which would preclude taxing said costs to the person filing said petition, believes it to be in the best interests of the County that the expense of considering vacation or abandonment of a county road should be taxed at least in substantial part, upon the person so petitioning.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF HITCHCOCK COUNTY, NEBRASKA that any person who files a petition in the Hitchcock County Clerk's office requesting the vacation or abandonment of any county road in Hitchcock County must also include with the petition, a deposit of \$1,500.00 payable to Hitchcock County, Nebraska, and the County Board shall not proceed on the petition unless and until said deposit has been received.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that following the County Board's decision on the petition, any amount of said deposit in excess of the actual costs and expenses incurred by the County shall be returned to said person.
