Member Nichols moved to direct Chair to execute IRS Form 720 Patient Centered Outcomes Research annual filing. Member Baker seconded the motion and after consideration, the following members voted in favor of the motion: Wertz, Baker and Nichols. Motion carried.

Assessor Terra Riggs advised as to the need for drop points for food pantries within the county. It was the consensus of the board to allow for a food pantry drop off point within the courthouse.

County Attorney D. Eugene Garner joined the meeting.

Sheriff Ryan King discussed a proposal for K-9 services with the board as well as various budgetary items.

Discussion was held on the status of Road 370.

Kylie Joyc, Director, Region II Services and Mandy Bruoussard, Director, Southwest Area Training Services provided said agencies' annual update.

Discussion held on the Hanna:Keelan Associates quote for update of the County's Comprehensive Plan and Zoning Regulations. It was the consensus of the board to solicit additional informal quotes.

Pursuant to NEB. REV. STAT. §47-109 the jail facility was visited.
